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
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Workshop aims



Feedback from 2024 event



502 attended (staff, students and the public)

98% said they would attend again next year



30 participants already requested being involved next year



Stalls and performances receive most engagement (78%)



Attendees felt the walk and yoga sessions reduce anxiety and give people a chance to connect with others in calmer environment

Option 1 Intersectional Event Planning


- Work in stages with chat-based check-ins
